Our History Fair Is Now History

On February 19, 2015, the Clifton Cheder Children's History Museum, created by the elementary school grades, opened their classroom exhibits for family and friends. This event was the culmination of weeks/months of research, reading and writing. Every student's research was depicted along the Jewish/World History Timeline in their classroom. This

allowed students and parents alike to gain contextual understanding of the historical events in relation to one another, to Jewish history, American history and World history.

The unique class presentations included an inter-curricular learning component with the proper Torah perspectives.

Each class studied a select Social Studies

topic and found a creative way to display their work. Mrs. Fleischer's First Grade studied American History, with emphasis on Presidents George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Both the Revolutionary War and Civil War were studied. The students prepared booklets with information and wrote essays about the changes they would make if they were elected as presidents.

Mrs. Goldberg's Second Grade studied Goods and Services. They built a replica of old Passaic out of Lego and Clicks. Their Passaic Township was complete with a projected image of the Passaic River roaring by, and a Shul and Yeshiva as well. The boys researched and wrote about when these Goods/Services began in the Passaic-Clifton area, explaining the benefits and the process to be qualified to supply the

community with these important needs.

Mrs. Spitzer's Third Grade researched famous inventors. Their Wacky Wax Museum figures came to life once one "answered the phone" or "lifted the elevator." The student then explained how the invention came to be, and included interesting biographical information regarding his inventor.

Mrs. Gutstein's Fourth Grade spent several months learning

American History and States specifically. Each student had a binder filled with the research he had collected and written regarding the state he was assigned.

The Fifth Grade curriculum is a continuation of American History. Mr. Allen's Fifth Grade students researched American Presidents,

and each boy wrote a comprehensive report regarding a specific president.

Mrs. Davidovici's Sixth Grade studied World History. Their research concentrated on Countries around the World. Each student had a binder filled with information he had learned and written. Visitors had the opportunity to sample the cuisine of a number of countries.


Mr. Kanrich's Seventh Grade studied famous

Historical Speeches. The boys researched the historical context, the biographies of the speakers, and the language style employed.

The event reverberated with a sense of accomplishment and pride for the students and teachers as well. Our parents were impressed with the creativity demonstrated and the skills and knowledge that their children had gained.





This past Sunday once again found our Rebbeim hard at work at another Limudei Kodesh In-Service, focusing on the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People by Stephen Covey.

viewed and added to the work that the staff had done on the first three of Covey's Habits: BE PROACTIVE, BEGIN WITH THE END IN MIND, and PUT FIRST THINGS

these three vital areas are labeled "The Private Victory," allowing a person to be truly independent. In this session, Rabbi Lazar re-The Rebbeim reviewed the concepts of paradigm shifts and learned about the difference

between a person's sphere of concern vs. their sphere of influence. This brought to mind the famous AA Prayer of Serenity, "G-d, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference."

FIRST. In Covey's understanding,

all change needs to be made

from the inside out. Growth in


Rabbi Lazar reviewed some differences between bottom line management and tip line leadership. Management is doing things right: leadership is doing the right things. Management is efficiently climbing the ladder; leadership is making sure that

the ladder is leaning against the correct wall. Management without leadership is akin to straightening the chairs on the deck of the Titanic!

To successfully Begin with the End in Mind, our Rebbeim reviewed the importance of a Personal Mission Statement. In this session, time was given to help discover what our personal mission is, different than any other person's who walked the face of this Earth. Aided by an article by Sara Yocheved Rigler, and a selection of the Slonimer Rebbe זצ"ל in his ספר נתיבות שלום. we analyzed how a person can detect his/her mission.

Before ending, and beginning their teaching day, the staff reviewed the importance of spending more time in Quadrant II, the area that Dr. Covey labels Important but Not Urgent, and watched an entertaining video of Stephen Covey demonstrating his "Big Rocks/Little Rocks" theory.


