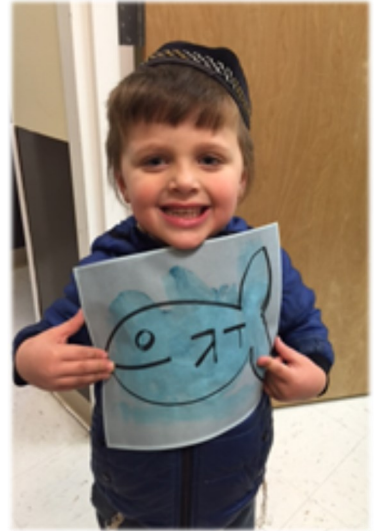

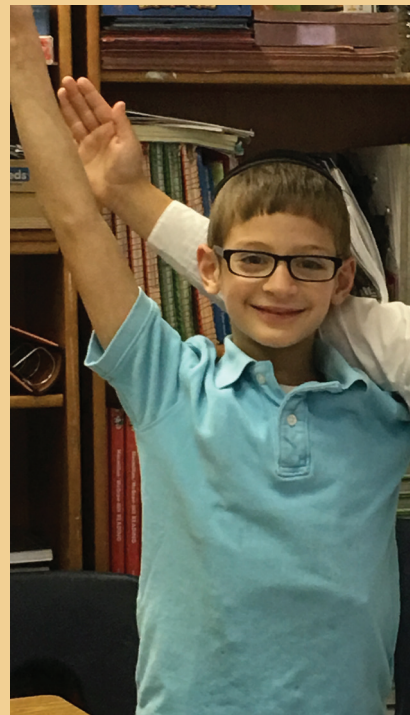

The Ripples of Reading Readiness

Morah Acoca, Morah Sarah and their Pre1A girls can be found each morning doing fun Aleph Bais work including spelling out words with Bananagram tiles (the Ivris version), sifting through sand for Aleph-Bais flashcards, and clapping out and graphing the syllables in their classmates names. If you are lucky enough to have a daughter in that warm and wonderful room, you may be wondering, why ever so? There's a large, dominant Aleph-Bais chart hanging, from which the girls can chant and read, and they each have a copy of Rabbi Blau's clear, comprehensive ספר קריאה נעימה for classwork and homework. Why are Kriah centers necessary as well?

We'll leave the "different modalities for different learners" on the side for now, and focus on reading readiness, and how we can actually accelerate attaining that developmental milestone.

As are walking and talking, being ready to read is a stage of development, one that most children meet by the age of six. Being ready to read entails the ability to visually discriminate between the different letters, the ability to auditorily discriminate between the various sounds, the ability to produce those sounds, and an understanding of words being made up of sounds. That auditory skill set is what we call phonemic awareness, the ability to hear, identify and manipulate individual sounds.

Phonemic awareness skills are clearly broken down and follow a natural progression of language development in the young child. We begin with an ability to identify beginning sounds, then ending sounds, and finally middle, or vowel sounds.

When you read a writing sample of your child, you will see this as LF for leaf, RD for red, SRA for Sara, LT for לוט; as children progress, they will "hear" the n e k u d a and vowel sounds, and their writing will reflect that. Brainstorming words that begin with letter D, or

end with the 'א ו ת ס' sound, helps us develop that ability.

The ability to separate sentences into words, rhyming and syllabifying, the breaking of words into syllables, are all key to reading readiness. As Morah Acoca plans her Aleph-Bais centers, she plans for skill building in phonemic awareness, because she understands that reading is made up of much more than the ability to identify a letter and its sound, both in 'א 'ב and in the ABC's. When the girls work with their Morah clapping out the syllables of the names of the people in the פרשה, or filling in the blank to create a rhyme, they are building foundations for their reading.

These are skills that you can work on at home, with your Pre1A girls and boys, and even with their younger siblings.

When you are eating dinner, or taking a trip in the car, you can use the time to play fun lan-

guage games that will develop these phonemic awareness skills. Some ideas can be rhyming games like "Willoughby Wallaby Woo," "Word Lists," I start with

"hat," you respond "cat," I reply "bat," you think of.... Or "I am Thinking of a Rhyme," "I am thinking of something Aba wears that rhymes with pie." "I am thinking of something you like to eat for dinner that rhymes with beet."

Beginning or ending sound games can be fun, such as "Five Words." You can list four words that start with the same sound, and give your child a hint for the fifth - "I'm thinking of an animal that starts with the same sound as mommy, marbles, muffins, macaroni." "I'm thinking of something you like to play with

that starts with the same sound as baby, bottle, banana, basket." The game of "Names" is also always a favorite. "I know someone you love whose name starts with the same sound as zoo." "I know a brother whose name starts with the same sound as door."

Exercising and developing your child's phonemic awareness with games such as these at home, and through the work we do in school, will **בעזרת ה'** enable them to master **קריאה** and English reading seamlessly, in an enjoyable way. And when LF turns into LEEF instead of LEAF, in time, we can talk about that, too.

Surrounded by a dining room full of pictures of **גדולי ישראל**, both past and present, the conversation naturally turned to stories of **גדולים** both well known, recorded in **ספרים** and personal.

The combination of Mrs. Lazar's delicious food and Rabbi Reischer's **הארכיגע** music made the evening a synthesis of **גשמי** and **רוחני**.

הנה מה טוב ומה נעים שבת אחים גם יחד - we couldn't have said it any better!

Following the night's **סעודה**, and having just discussed some of these same **גדולי ישראל**, Rabbi Lazar and a group of Rebbeim grabbed the opportunity to visit the Monsey **בית הקברות**.

that involve tactile functions are some of the different opportunities available for students to make strategic choices, reinforce concepts and skills, and appreciate their progress. These opportunities let students learn!



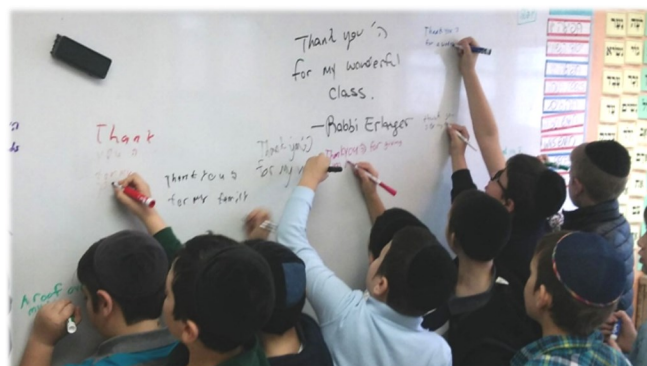
A Special Guest

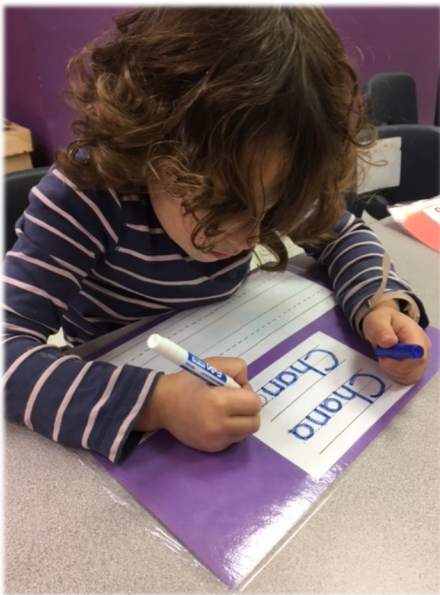

The Benefits of Schedules - Even for Little People

It's now been a full month since the ימים טובים and we can suddenly feel Chanukah in the

air. The month of חשוון has been a great month of learning, playing, working and getting to know each other. Within their familiar routines and schedules, our smallest students are empowered by the familiarity of their day. Schedules in a preschool classroom are of paramount importance and having a schedule that the students can "read" (on their level) is so important. Even though a child aged two to five years old can't typically tell time, they understand the order of their day, and can form a pattern or sequence in their minds. Much thought is put into their schedule by their Moros, with a balance of whole group learning (meeting time on the rug), small group learning (through various centers relating to the weekly themes - including literacy, Science, Math, פרשה and more), outdoor play, indoor play, story time, snack time, lunch time, music and movement, clean up time and more.

A predictable routine allows children to develop a self-sufficiency that will אי"ה accompany them into their future years. It allows them build trust with their peers and teachers. It creates a feeling of comfort in their environment; allowing them to learn, play and explore.
