

Time to Sing & Time to Dance!







Peek inside a Bais Yaakov classroom on a Tuesday morning, and what will you see? Girls dancing, clapping beats and tempos, and singing songs! It's our very own Morah Perel's music and movement class!

When you think of children taking part in music and movement, some may think of children running around singing at the top of their lungs or banging noisily on an instrument. Many don't realize that just like math, science, reading or writing, music and movement plays an important role in a child's development and has many benefits.

- 1. Mental capacity and intellect: There is a connection between music and the development of mathematical thinking. Mathematical concepts are developed as children sing.
- 2. Mastery of the physical self: Children develop coordination, which aids muscular development. They begin to understand what they can do with their bodies as they run, balance, stretch, crawl, and skip. They also recognize themselves, in relation to those around them. They will understand themselves in their space.
- 3. Development of social/emotional skills and self expression: Through music and movement, children learn acceptable outlets to express feelings and relieve tension. Music and movement may also convey a specific mood through which children reveal their feelings and emotions.
- 4. Development of creativity: Music can create an imaginary world that stimulates a child's creativity. A box can become a drum, a stick can be transformed into a horn, or a broom can become a dance partner. Children make up songs or give new words to old songs for pure enjoyment.
- 5. Opportunities for success: Everyone can thrive in a music and movement class! Entirely process based, there are no tests to take or quizzes to study for. The music and movement class is safe, and in it everyone is a star!



Something Special Is Happening at the Cheder...



At Clifton Cheder we look at the whole child. Each child in our school deserves to be healthy, safe, engaged, supported, and challenged. At our school, we teach beyond the scope of the Common Core Standards, to ensure that all the student's needs are met, whether purely academic or not. What does that mean? Students in grades 2-4 rotate through 3 co-curricular classes.

Beginning with a unit on basketball, the boys will learn about

different sports, and practice different gross motor skills. At the same time, the boys will about learn their health and taking care of themselves, and working with those around Get them. ready for skills, physical development, and a variety of different sports games!

Music: With benefits ranging from developing self expression to practicing memorization to building up self confidence, music is an intelligence that can be fostered and subsequently enhance all areas of learning. We welcome Eli Beer, highly acclaimed musician, chazzan, and student of Belz School of Jewish Music. Mr. Beer will be teaching our classes the practice, skill, and creative freedom of music. Get ready for instruments, songs, movement, and more!

Theater: Theater in Education (TIE) is a process in which drama practices are used to help aid the educational process. Through games, activities, and by encouraging our own student's creativity, our school's speaking and listening objectives will be met. IY"H students will develop self confidence, skills, and presence, and every student will earn a well received round of applause!

Building Leaders: Our Special's program would not be possible without the collaborative effort of our very own eighth graders. Gym and Music each have an 8th grade connection - 8th graders assist in both the instruction and general guidance and support. 

Extra-Extra Read All About It!






