Literal Literature Lessons (and Alliteration...)

At the Clifton Cheder, our teachers are encouraged to incorporate hands on sensory learning into their formal lessons. By utilizing different learning modalities the children achieve a unique more well rounded understanding of the subject matter. Creative assignments appeal to the visual learner, the tactile, the kinesthetic and the auditory learner. It also makes for an engaging, fun, and

memorable learning experience.

Literature can be taught creatively. Our teachers choose classical pieces for the students to study, analyze and discuss. Some selections are chosen to demonstrate specific literary terms, vocabulary words, concepts, or author's writing style. Recently, our fourth arade learned about the types of conflict found in the plot of a short story, and the fifth grade learned about historical fiction and setting. These lessons were augmented with creative class projects.

Clay models of animals supplemented the literature lesson last week. The short story Sato and the Elephants by Juanita Havilo was studied in class. Sato is


































Chinuch Corner

I would like to share with you two inspirational ideas that were shared at the recent Agudah Convention which I was not to attend.

The first is from R' Mattisyahu Solomon שליט"א, Mashgiach of Beth Medrash Govoha in Lakewood. People think, said the Mashgiach that בחירה is "free will," the ability to choose and do whatever you please. This is not accurate. Doing what you naturally want, what your instincts tell you, is no different than what animals do. Real בחירה given to humans is to do what we know is right even if at times we don't want to do it.

Rav Mattisyahu went on to explain that we should teach our children to be able to say no to some of the things that they want. This is true חינוף. Learn to say no and to be happy with the no.

Easier said than done, no? Most

certainly! R' Matissyahu שליט"א provided one way to instill this idea within our children.

Role model!

While you are walking to shul, tell your son how difficult it was for you to get out of bed because you were so tired and that you really "wanted" to go back to sleep. Instead you did what you "did not want to do" and I am so much happier now that I am davening with a minyan on time. I did what my body did not want to do in order to fulfill 'a.

When the opportunity lends itself - grab it and try to teach children to say no and even be happy with it.

The second idea is from R' Shmuel Berkovicz שליט"א, Rav of Khal Yereim and S'gan Menahel in Yeshiva Ketana of Passaic.

He said that he was never invited to speak at an Agudah Convention before and this may be the last time as well because of what he was about to say!

Rabbi Berkovicz שליט"א said that

father/son learning on Friday night always bothered him. There should be father/son Othello; or father/son checkers! He spoke of the importance of spending time with your children, just playing games and having fun.

Perhaps we can use Rabbi Berkovicz's thought to help us, just a little, with the challenging task we are faced with from Rav Matissyahu.

It is so important to create a close, ever-lasting relationship with each one of our children. The benefits are endless. Perhaps this is one of those benefits. If your son/daughter is close with you and looks up to you, all the more so he/she will be receptive to the values you give over and all the more so he/she will be receptive to the values you practice. If we show them that we can be sincerely happy with the "no's" we say to our own desires, they will certainly want to emulate us.

a sculptor who wants nothing more than to acquire ivory with which to sculpt. After receiving a piece, he found the remains of a bullet in the ivory. He struggled with a strong internal conflict. Sculpting with ivory was his



dream, but the bullet he found reminded him that the elephant was shot and hurt in order for him to have his carving materi-

als. Ultimately he resolved to sculpt from other materials, and kept an ivory elephant made out of the ivory with the bullet as a reminder of the resolution of his conflict.

In line with the resolution of the main characthe ter. boys created their W sculptures of different animals. The boys discussed

and shared different internal conflicts that they experienced. They described the choices that they had considered as well as the personal decision or resolution to the conflict.



It is not every day that fifth grade boys get to practice architecture, but as a culminating activity after reading the short story, New Providence: A changing Cityscape by Renata von Tscharner and Ronal Lee Fleming, the fifth grade class

'built a city'. This historical fiction selection is unique in the sense that it had no characters, or plot, rather it focuses solely on the descriptive element, the setting. The story takes the reader from the year 1910 through the year 1992 and compares and



contrasts physical features of the city over the 82 year period with special attention placed on the years 1910, 1935, 1955, 1970, 1980, and 1992. The boys were very enthusiastic about the challenge to build a city. They were given a poster board, popsicle sticks, and glue and told to build whatever they could on the 22x28 inch surface. The city was named Base 21 and includes a prison, hospital, mansion, mall, drive-through restaurant, restroom, and most importantly Chaim's Lamborghini garage. It also included a park, welcome sign, stop sign, and speed limit sign of 125 mph. The boys definitely saw the fruits of their labor and enjoyed a fun and interactive hands on activity.
