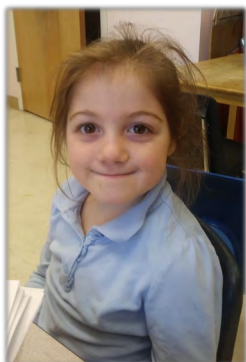


“What Have You Been Up to in School?,” asked Mrs. Gilden



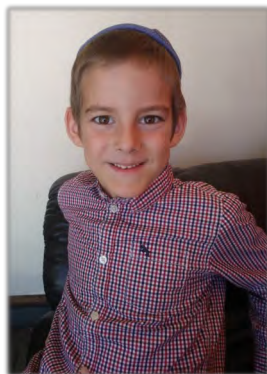
Pre1A Boys:

that it is short so I don't have to read it so much. I can read it fast! We play tic-tac-toe with the word from it. I am good at it, it is fun!



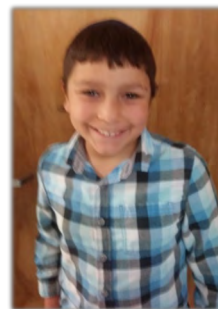
2B: Dovid Sha-

When It All Comes Together

Many years ago, I took a special liking to the study of ספר יונה. Perhaps that connection dates back to my first pediatrician who, taking note of my first name, would ask me how life was when I was in the whale :) Be that as it may, when I discovered the פירוש of the Vilna Gaon on the hidden messages of this special ספר, my love for this נביא increased even further.

This year, ב"ה I had the great fortune of sharing a 3 part series of both old and new thoughts on ספר יונה with Cheder fathers. The Fillet of Soul series provided special opportunities to prepare for the ימי הדין and recalibrate on our life's mission. Of course the new friendships and delicious food added גשמיות to our רוחניות pursuit.

However, it is one specific chain of השגחה פרטית that I would like to share with our B'Chadrei Chadorim readers.

As I sat one night preparing for

the next evening's שיעור, I decided to "read up" on a fascinating postscript to ספר יונה.

In חז"ל and תנ"ך there seems not to be any mention of יונה הנביא having any descendants. How surprising it was when about 150 years ago in the ancient cemetery of L'vov, Poland of all places, were unearthed of local מצבות גדולי הרבנים from the קיקיניש family - listed as descendants of יונה הנביא. It seems that they emigrated from Portugal hundreds of years earlier and on their previously buried tombstones there are pictures of two fish! The fish seemingly connect to the two fish יונה was inside of (in the שיעורים we learned there may even have been a 3rd!) and קיקיניש is very possibly connected to the קיקיון plant that grew over יונה's head. Amongst these families was a woman אודיל, בת מוה"ר משה קיקיניש, who gave up her life 'על קידוש ה', defending her city in a blood libel. How נתפעל I was that although it was hun-

dreds of years later, that night was her precise יאהרצייט!

The next night at the שיעור, I shared the discovery with the group of fathers and mentioned the amazing fact of her יאהרצייט.

I thought the story was done.

However, on this past שבת I was perusing one of Rav Yitzchok Zilberstein ספרים's popular 'שליט"א. In the back of ספר ברכי נפשי, Rav Zilberstein records practical שאלות that come up on the מצוות listed in the Chofetz Chaim's ספר מצוות הקצר.

There, Rav Zilberstein quotes another ספר where the author recounts the story of the parting hour of his forbearer who died על קידוש ה'.

In the city of Drahbisht, before פסח, a non-Jewish maid hid a dead child in this woman's house, claiming she had been instructed to do so by the Jewish homeowner. After realizing the danger the town's Jews were now in, the

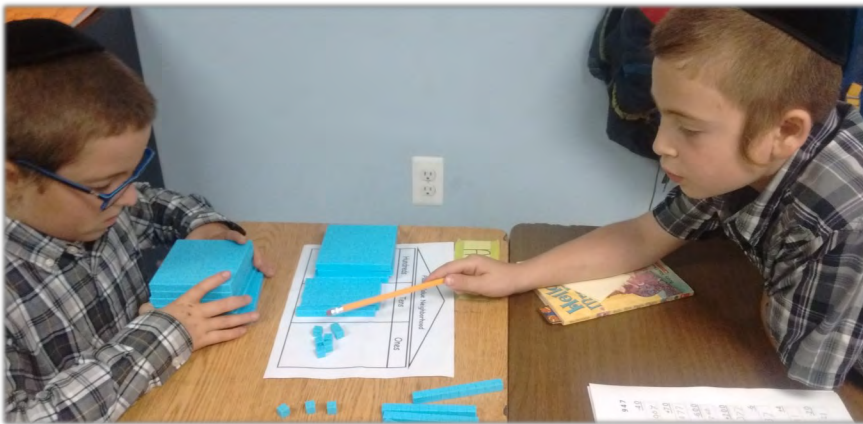

The Little that is Big

It's wonderful to be back in school, and to look at the long stretch of almost empty boxes on the calendar, up to mid November when Whoa! How'd that creep up on us?! Parent Teacher Conferences right there, November 15th black on white. Actually, **its intentional**, that PTC's scheduled so early in the year, so that we can meet and talk and network and confirm, brainstorm and ensure that our children are on the success path, heading in the right direction. From now until we meet next month, we'll be doing our T part to foster academic and social success in (y)our children; can you pick up the P? There are so many small, and big, ways you can foster that success as well.

Begin with the most obvious - Homework. Helping your child develop good homework habits now will help them keep pace with the class now, and in their future schooling as work and responsibilities become more challenging. You can help by creating a schedule; some children love to get their homework done and out of the way as soon as they get home; others need some time to unwind, good exercise and movement, a crunchy snack, before they can

tackle more work. Learn what works best for your child and maintain that schedule.

Set up a conducive work area. Stock crayons, pencils, sharpeners, erasers. Minimize noise and distraction. Use natural incentives to help children stay focused and on task, i.e., let's see if you can read the whole page before the three-minute timer rings, before the pasta cooks, before we hear Daddy's car pull into the garage.



Talk to your child about her day. Talk. Don't interrogate. Ask her to share something good about her day. Something fun she did or funny that happened. Wonder if Morah spoke about Noach, camels, twins. Tell her about something pleasant that happened in your day. Listen to her stories. Take interest in those stories.

Make time to together look at the work your children bring home. Notice the details, the

skills the work reinforces. Marvel at how grown up the material is, and how sophisticated the work. Display good work on the refrigerator or bulletin board. Point it out to visiting relatives and friends.

Notice your child's mood, her interest and enthusiasm for school, or hopefully not, the lack thereof. Be in touch with us there so we can head off any difficulty quickly and nip it before it mushrooms. Please don't ever dwell on that with your little girl, encourage her

to focus on the positive parts of her day, while we develop a plan.

Communicate with us. Keep Morah informed, let her know when something is going on. A simcha, a business trip, vacation or visitors. It is always helpful to share anything that might be a change to your child's normal.

Set up a good daily routine and schedule, and try to maintain that, even on

Shabbos and Sundays, as much as possible.

Encourage good eating habits. Offer healthful, nutritious snacks, and a hearty breakfast before heading out to a long day of school.

So many little things, so many big things; so many little things that can make a big difference in your child's day. Let's work together to help her succeed in a big way!

Jewish woman falsely admitted guilt and claimed that she alone had asked to have the child killed. Everyone else in their town was uninvolved. She was sentenced to death and the rest of the Yidden were saved.

The maid later admitted that her story was fabricated but the priests of the town would only spare the Jewish woman's life if she would convert. The woman refused and happily gave up her life **על קידוש ה'** with pride.

On a Friday afternoon, she dressed for **שבת**, lit her candles with a **ברכה**, then was taken to be burned at stake. She joined the millions who have died over the **דורות** for being Jewish.

This woman was none other than **אודיל קיקניש הי"ד**, the worthy descendant of **יונה הנביא** whose **יאהרצייט** we had marked.

However, it was the question that Rav Zilberstein posed that

connected us even further. He asked how this **צדקת** could light **נרות שבת** with a **ברכה** when she knew that she wouldn't return home after dark? In **הלכות שבת** the **שו"ע** teaches that if a woman lights candles in a different location than she eats, she needs to assure that the candles are long enough for her to benefit from their light after it gets dark. Otherwise her **ברכה** will be **לבטלה**. How was **אודיל הי"ד** able to light with a **ברכה** when she knew she'd be killed and not return to benefit from the light?

I gasped, as this **הלכה** was precisely what our Cheder Morning Halacha Kollel was studying in **משנה ברורה**! Out of the tens of thousands of **הלכות**, our group is currently studying **הלכות שבת**; the laws of **הדלקת נרות**; but specifically this **הלכה** of making sure the candles are long enough if you will not be in their presence during the **סעודה**.

Simply amazing! What **השגחה פרטית**! We are humbled that ה' allowed us a glimpse into seeing how the myriad details of our lives are planned with such precise synchronization.

Additionally, a weekly in depth study class of **ספר יונה** began before **יו"ט** with our oldest students. I look forward to learning with our future graduates and together uncovering more of the mysteries hidden in the 48 **פסוקים** of this incredible **ספר**.

The 6th graders too, pictured here, wanted to "get in" on the learning excitement. We had a chance to give them a one day crash course as well. Their knowledge of the special **נביא** story and many of its pertinent **מדרשים** laid the foundation for the lessons taught.

We are **מתפלל** that we all grow from our learning and uncover ה' messages He sends our way.
